

UMass Cybersecurity Club General Body Meeting

"Measures taken to protect a computer or computer system (as on the Internet) against unauthorized access or attack"


- Merriam-Webster

You do not have to stay the whole time! Come to whichever portion interests you (or both).


Guest Talks

- Great place to study and get work done






Hacker Hours
